Bill Erikson HF Challenge

This will be the final reporting of scores for the 2016 HF Challenge. The January ArcOver will introduce next year's event, summarizing the classes, reporting procedures, and any changes that Administrator Joe NA9A may have in store for us. Final scores for the 2016 Challenge will be announced at our annual winter banquet next month and in the February edition of the ArcOver.

There are still a few weeks left to boost your score, and participant Larry K9ARZ encourages everyone not to give up on the higher bands. He reported working Swaziland, Madagascar, Barbados, Ghana, Andorra, Sable Island, Greenland, Western Kiribati, Central Kiribati, Corsica, Antigua, Micronesia, Montserrat, Bermuda, and Chatham Island during the last reporting period.

Out in the northwest, participant Dick AH6EZ/W7 is busy on the other end of the bands. "Just put up my highest and longest antenna ever to get ready for the lower bands," he said. "I have been very active on 60m with 100 watts in advance of the possible downgrade to new FCC rules only allowing 15w. A non-resonant tuned dipole with ladder line, 160 feet long 90 feet

high. I will be using a Palstar BT1500 balanced tuner for the lowest loss. I can use a Wellbrook loop antenna for lower receive noise if I need to."

Joe NA9A reported working two new entities for the year, Central Africa and Sable Island. He also offered a heads -up on rare DX coming up soon, JD1/M** - Minami Torishima. "This will be a rare one," he said, "having two asterisks in the FRRL Challenge. JG8NQJ/JD1 is planning to be on the air just before Christmas with activity through the first quarter of 2017. This gives us opportunities in 2016 and again in the first half of 2017. Point your antenna to 306° and work him. QSL via JA8CJY."

I was portable in Northern Wisconsin (a no noise location for me). The results were really great. The Antenna performed well and allowed me to have some great Qso's with Florida, Ohio and Arizona on 40 and 12 meters. 80 was awesome and so quiet in the mornings I could talk to all the locals in upper Wisconsin with no noise. I operated this time with a battery pack which is something new I wanted to try for emergency and portable operation. The battery unit utilizes two SLA batteries, but I am saving up for some new Lithium Iron Phosphate batteries. The LiFePO4 batteries have a different discharge curve than SLA and they are much lighter for about the same amperage. Time will tell.

And now that we are in December and have already had our first major snow it's time to plan for the next holiday, Christmas and our banquet in January. I don't know how you all go about sending your wishes to Santa Clause, but I am sure that DX Engineering or HRO might have just the thing for Santa to bring on Christmas Day. 
