

Tour de Cure 2010

21 Ham Radio operators (and 2 non-Hams) and several groups from across the Chicago area came together on June 13th to support the American Diabetes Association and the 2010 Tour de Cure/Chicago. The Tour de Cure is a yearly fund-raising event for the ADA in its quest to find a cure for Diabetes. Amateur Radio has supported this event for over 5 years now. Hams provide SAG support as well as health, safety and logistics communications for this event.

The ride consists of three courses that cater to all levels of riders: a 25k, 60k and 100k. This year, the ride was headquartered at Wheaton-Warrenville South High School, with the 25/60k courses using the IL Prairie Path and the Fox River Trail, and the 100k being an open road course using the streets of DuPage and Kane Counties.

The ride this year had over 400 registered riders. The TdC Comm Team fielded support for 6 Rest Stops, as well as 6 SAG vehicles that covered the three courses. There were also 3 'bike mobile' operators that rode the 25/60k courses in case cyclists needed help on the trails. For the second time, APRS was used to track the SAG vehicles to provide more efficient servicing of SAG requests.

The American Red Cross of Greater Chicago provided its communications trailer from their Kane County Community Center to function as the command post. The Fox River Radio League loaned one of its field antenna support mast systems, and the North Shore Radio Club provided additional APRS tracker units for SAG vehicles.
