Annual dues are payable no later than the January Club Meeting each year. New members joining during the year will have their first year's dues prorated to the nearest yearly quarter.

Regular dues are \$25.00 a year, Senior Citizen dues are \$15.00. Family dues are \$35.00. Members can help support the FRRL Repeaters by making an annual \$10.00 donation.

Current language for member dues as printed in the FRRL By-Laws, amended May 9, 2006:

Article XII - Dues

Section 1. The membership dues of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. shall be twenty-five dollars

(\$25.00) per year; except that senior citizens (65 & older), military personnel on active duty, and full-time students not yet having attained their twenty-second birthday, shall pay fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per year. A family membership shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per year regardless of the number of members. A senior family membership (at least one spouse is 65 or older) shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00) per year.

Proposed Amendment to the FRRL By-Laws:

Effective for membership dues payable for 2019:

Increase the Regular membership dues by \$5.00 from \$25.00 to \$30.00, increase the Family membership dues by \$5.00 from \$35.00 to \$40.00 and increase the Senior dues by \$10.00 from \$15.00 to \$25.00, the Senior Family dues will be eliminated. These dues will become effective for FY 2019.

Whereas, this may create a short-fall, if the BOD is not able to resolve the shortfall, it may access up to \$1000 from the club savings account.

New language to amend the FRRL By-Laws amended May 9, 2006 upon approval of the membership on December 12, 2017:

Article XII - Dues

Section 1. The membership dues of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00) per year; except that senior citizens (65 & older), military personnel on active duty, and full-time students not yet having attained their twenty-second birthday, shall pay twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per year. A family membership shall be forty dollars (\$40.00) per year regardless of the number of members.

These dues will become effective for FY 19. Whereas, this may create a short-fall, if the BOD is not able to resolve the shortfall, it may access up to \$1000 from savings.

An additional motion by Bill NF9D was brought to the floor: That future treasurer reports include all funds that are assets of this organization. This was seconded by Robert W9DSR. The motion passed unanimously.


