Meeting Minutes November 14, 2023

The November meeting of the Fox River Radio League was conducted at Bethany Lutheran Church in Batavia, IL. There were 42 members in attendance and 5 members attended via Zoom.

The meeting was called to order at 1930 CST by President Terry, W9AUV

Repeater Committee met October 25th by Zoom.

Matters discussed:



Changes and improvements for Elburn and Plano repeater site. Note; Since that repeater meeting two visits to the Plano have taken place by Pete Walter, K9PW and Kermit Carlson W9XA. More measurements will be made to the antenna system.

The cellular-based internet "Verizon Jetpack" module was found to have stopped working in late October with a battery failure. The "Jetpack" unit was to have been phased out with the change in the service area from generation-3 "Gen3" to "Gen4-LTE" last year. The main impact was that the Plano DMR System had become stand-alone and was not connected to the CC-Chicagoland Bridge.

A hard-line internet connection has been installed for the repeaters, this connection is being provided without charge. The connection has been operating flawlessly and the DMR Plano repeater has remained connected continuously since the installation was completed.

The Elburn site had been visited in September for work on the Voter and control systems. {Update - a visit to the Elburn site for measurements and improvements was made by K9PW and W9XA on November 8th.}

Work on the voting system has been progressing. Curt Sauer, W9YNP, has been working on the All-Star Voter system. Note-since the Repeater Board meeting, Curt has made significant progress, and the voter is working on the bench. This All-Star voter will allow for the use of multiple receivers for the 147.21 MHz FM repeater.

223.86 FM Repeater Temporary site and Permanent site; A potential site owner is seeking permission from the main tower tenant for the installation of the FRRL 222 repeater at a long-term location in a central Kane County. There is no definite agreement at this time.

There is a plan to have a tower crew install an antenna and feed-line on the W9XA tower in Batavia for a temporary location. That installation is pending the schedule and availability of a tower crew. The temporary installation will be done with no cost to the FRRL.

All of the repeater systems continue to operate normally

2023 SKYWARN™ Recognition Day

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and the National Weather Service (NWS) are finalizing plans for 2023 SKYWARN™ Recognition Day. The event is held annually on the first Friday and Saturday of December, so this year it will be on Friday, December 1, and Saturday, December 2. SKYWARN Recognition Day was developed in 1999 by the NWS and ARRL. It celebrates the contributions that volunteer SKYWARN amateur radio operators make to the NWS. During the event, SKYWARN operators visit NWS offices and contact other radio operators across the world. <u>Winter Field Day</u> is January 23-24, 2024. According to its website: "Winter Field Day (WFD) is a communications exercise. WFD is held on the last full weekend in January. WFD can be worked from the comfort of your home or in a remote location. You can participate by yourself or get your friends, family, or whole club involved. Winter Field Day is open to participants worldwide. Amateur radio operators may use frequencies on the HF, VHF, or UHF bands and are free to use any mode that can faithfully transmit the required exchange intact. Similar to the ARRL Field Day, bonus points are earned in several ways, including using non-commercial power sources, operating from remote locations, satellite contacts, and more.

Santa Net

The 16th annual Santa Net will be on the air evenings at 7:00 PM CT between Thanksgiving



and Christmas on 3.916 MHz. Check in is taken 30 minutes before the net begins. Youngsters can talk to Santa at the north pole using strategically placed operators who relay the voice of Santa. 





The Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES) consists of licensed amateurs who have voluntarily registered their qualifications and equipment, with their local ARES leadership, for communications duty in the public service when disaster strikes. Every licensed amateur, regardless of membership in ARRL or any other local or national organization is eligible to apply for membership in ARES. Training may be required or desired to participate fully in ARES. Please inquire at the local level for specific information. Because ARES is an amateur radio program, only licensed radio amateurs are eligible for membership. The possession of emergency-powered equipment is desirable, but is not a requirement for membership.

ARES

Every licensed amateur, regardless of membership in ARRL or any other local or national organization is eligible to apply for membership in ARES.
