

Morse Code is still thriving in amateur radio 24 years after its last commercial use.



On July 12, 1999, the original dot/dash system, invented by Samuel F. B. Morse in 1837, gave way to the rapid development of analog and digital communications. The final message sent in Morse code for commercial use was the same one that Morse hammered out on his telegraph key 155 years earlier in 1844, which was, "What hath God wrought?" But this time the message was followed by SK, meaning silent key, or deceased. The International Maritime Organization replaced Morse code with the Global Maritime Distress and Safety System -- an

automated ship-to-shore and ship-to-ship system that use satellites and/or terrestrial radio systems with digital selective calling technology. Morse Code is also still used in aviation. Pilots listen to a Morse code identifier to verify that their navigation receivers are tuned to the correct radio aid, such as a VHF Omni-Directional Range (VOR) or Instrument Landing System (ILS) approach guidance system. Railroads stopped using Morse code in the mid-1970s. While Morse code is no longer used commercially, it is still an integral part of amateur radio. Amateur radio operators are no longer required to learn Morse code to obtain their license, but many learn the code on their own or by using study guides and taking classes. Every day, amateurs around the world use Morse code to communicate with each other, test their radio equipment, or pass along friendly information. Morse code is essential in helping people communicate during disasters and emergencies because of its signal ability to penetrate adverse weather issues and propagation disturbance. VB-Audio Voicemeeter Pro (aka, "Banana") Tom Lebryk KD9NPR

Voicemeeter Banana (their Pro version) is an Advanced Audio Mixer Application endowed with Virtual Audio Device used as Virtual I/O to mix and manage any audio sources from or to any audio devices or applications. It is written by a very clever Audio/Video Professional in France, Mr. V. Burel. It can be very useful software but does take time to setup in a Windows PC. I use it if I feel I need some extra audio processing from my Kenwood 590S transceiver.

From my Kenwood, flat RX audio is output to a cheap Behringer U-Control UCA202 USB Audio Interface, then to a laptop USB port. In VoiceMeeter "Banana" software, audio is routed to Voicemeeter AUX for minor EQ, then output to a VB-point Input to a Limiter (to keep loud Ham signals from blowing out my ears!), then routed to a multiband Parametric EQ set to cut lower bass, emphasize midrange with 1000 Hz dip and emphasize 2000-2500 Hz, plus any notch I want to move around as needed. That is then sent to Output A2 sent to my Default laptop audio device. This allows easy use of the laptop headphone jack where I output the sound to whichever speaker/headphones/earbuds I choose to use, or alternatively, to a C.Crane FM Transmitter for multiroom listening.

The mixer has a built-in recorder to create mp3 files as needed. I have different profiles in Banana for different kinds of listening (HAM, AM/SW Broadcast, FM stereo music, etc). There is a way to route transmit audio through this mixer but I have not yet figured out how with my current setup.

I believe I only paid 10 Euro for a single user, non-commercial installation. The donation will also get you a license key to get rid of the nuisance trial-license messages.







The Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES) consists of licensed amateurs who have voluntarily registered their qualifications and equipment, with their local ARES leadership, for communications duty in the public service when disaster strikes. Every licensed amateur, regardless of membership in ARRL or any other local or national organization is eligible to apply for membership in ARES. Training may be required or desired to participate fully in ARES. Please inquire at the local level for specific information. Because ARES is an amateur radio program, only licensed radio amateurs are eligible for membership. The possession of emergency-powered equipment is desirable, but is not a requirement for membership.

ARES

Every licensed amateur, regardless of membership in ARRL or any other local or national organization is eligible to apply for membership in ARES.

THE FOX RIVER RADIO LEAGUE, INC. **BYLAWS**

Suggested Amendments by KC9EOQ May 1st, 2023

ENACTMENT

The final draft of this document was read and approved by the membership present at the Fox River Radio League, Inc. meeting held on June 11, 2019 and was duly recorded in the minutes of that meeting by the Secretary. Subsequent amendments are recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which they were passed.

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BYLAWS

Article I - Name

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be the Fox River Radio League, Inc. The common abbreviation of this name shall be FRRL.

Article II - Purpose

- Section 1. The purpose of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. shall be to provide a vehicle for the exchange of technical information and for improving the operational skills and enjoyment of both its members and other persons in amateur radio communications. Further, to provide a pool of skilled operators and equipment for use in community service or in the event of a community or national disaster.
- Section 2. The Fox River Radio League Inc., is a Section 501 (c)(3) tax-exempt not-for-profit corporation as defined by Federal and State of Illinois Statutes.

Article III - Membership

- Section 1. All persons interested in amateur radio shall be eligible for membership in the Fox River Radio League, Inc. To be a member, an individual or family must be up to date in payment of FRRL dues. To be eligible to vote on FRRL business, individuals must hold a valid amateur radio license
- Section 2. The Board of Directors may, with the approval of the membership, grant Honorary (nonvoting) membership in the Fox River Radio League, Inc. Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues. Honorary memberships shall automatically expire at each January membership meeting unless renewed for the following year by the Board of Directors.
- Section 3. The Board of Directors may, with the approval of the membership, grant Life membership in the Fox River Radio League, Inc. In order to be nominated for Life membership, a person must be able to prove licensed amateur radio status fifty (50) years prior to the nomination, and must have been a member of the FRRL for at least the last ten (10) consecutive years. A Life member shall have all the rights and privileges of a dues-paying member.
- Section 4. New members or returning members whose membership has lapsed for more than one year shall immediately enjoy all membership privileges except the right to participate in counted or balloted votes which shall be delayed two months from membership application receipt date.

Article IV - Officers

- Section 1. The officers of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. shall be: President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- Section 2. All officers shall be FRRL members, and shall hold a valid amateur radio license.

- Section 3. The term of all officers shall be for one (1) year starting with the regular February membership meeting and shall expire at the start of the following year's February meeting.
- Section 4. No two (2) family members covered by or eligible for the same Family Membership may hold **an** elected office or serve as a Director on the Board of Directors at the same time.
- Section 5. Vacancies occurring between elections must be filled by a special election, to be held at the next regular membership meeting following the one at which the vacancy was officially recorded in the corporation minutes.

Article V - Duties of Officers

- Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. and shall conduct same according to the rules adopted. The President shall enforce due observance of the FRRL Bylaws: decide all questions of order; sign all official documents that are adopted by the FRRL; appoint the Repeater Board, all committee chairs and, where specified, committee members; and shall perform all customary duties pertaining to the office of President. A member may serve as President for a maximum of two (2) consecutive terms.
- Section 2. The Vice-President shall assume all the duties of the President in the absence of the latter. The Vice President shall also assume the duties of any other absent officer and other duties as assigned.
- Section 3. The Secretary shall keep a record of the attendance at, and proceedings of all Membership and Board of Directors meetings; keep a list of the membership; carry on all corporation correspondence authorized by the Board of Directors unless otherwise assigned to another member; read communications at each meeting and other duties as assigned.
- Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all monies; pay all bills; and keep a just and regular account of the same. At each regular meeting, the Treasurer shall submit a financial report to the officers and the general membership. The Treasurer shall pay no bills greater than two hundred (\$200) for non-budgeted items without the approval of the general membership. All checks are to be signed by the Treasurer and one of the following officers; the President, Vice-President, or Secretary. Check cosigners shall not be related by blood or marriage. The Treasurer shall maintain control of the Club Debit Card(s) and report transactions to the Board of Directors on a monthly basis. The Treasurer shall also provide financial documents to the Board of Directors for a quarterly review. (Add) For purposes of compiling an annual budget, the Treasurer shall receive from each committee and Board of Directors member where appropriate, an estimate of costs for the next twelve (12) months. Budget components are due three (3) months before the end of the fiscal year (November 30) (Change to: on October 31st of each year.)

Article VI - Directors

- Section 1. All Directors shall be FRRL members and shall hold a valid amateur radio license.
- Section 2. The Board of Directors shall be comprised of the Officers of the Fox River Radio League, four (4) Directors elected by the membership, and one (1) Director who is the I mmediate (immediate) Past President. The President shall act as Chairman of the Board of Directors.
- Section 3. The duties of the Board of Directors are to conduct the necessary business of the FRRL as may occur between membership meetings; provide direction and guidance in achieving the goals and objectives of the FRRL; and assist committees (change to: all appointed Committee Chairpersons) and the Repeater Board in making decisions necessary to support FRRL activities and functions. Decisions of the Board of Directors shall stand.
- Section 4. The four Directors elected to the Board by the membership shall serve staggered two (2) year terms, with two (2) Directors elected each year. Whenever necessary, the initial term of any newly elected Director may be reduced by the membership in order to ensure that the term of two directors expire each year.

- Section 4. The four (4) Directors elected to the Board by the membership shall serve staggered two (2) year terms, with two (2) Directors elected each year. Whenever necessary, the initial term of any newly elected Director may be reduced by the membership in order to ensure that the term of two (2) directors expire each year.
- Section 5. The Immediate (change to: immediate) Past President shall serve as a Director until succeeded by the next retiring President. If the Immediate (change to: immediate) Past President is unable to serve as a Director, any other Past President shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year, or any fraction remaining, by the President, subject to confirmation by the Board of Directors.
- Section 6. Vacancies occurring between elections must be filled by a special election, to be held at the next regular membership meeting following the one at which the vacancy was officially recorded in the corporation minutes.

Article VII - Election of Officers and Directors

- Section 1. Nominations: The Nominating Committee shall present, at the November meeting, a slate of candidates consisting of a minimum of one (1) name per office. Nominations shall also be accepted from the floor at only the November meeting. All nominations shall be published in the next issue of the FRRL Newsletter and the FRRL Website (change to: website) no later than one week prior to the December meeting.
- Section 2. Election: The annual election of all officers and the directors shall take place at the December meeting. The balloting shall allow for write-in names. A candidate shall be declared elected if that candidate receives the most votes cast by the members. (add: At the discretion of the Board of Directors, an electronic voting system may be used.
- Section 3. Absentee Ballots: Absentee ballots are allowed only for the election of officers and directors. The absentee ballot shall be prepared by the voter and delivered prior to the start of the meeting at which the annual election of officers and directors is held. The office being voted on with the first and last names or the callsign of each candidate shall be listed on this ballot. The completed ballot may be sent via email or physical means. The email ballot shall be sent to the chair of the nomination committee. Alternatively, a physical ballot may be enclosed in a sealed envelope that is both printed and signed in ink using first and last name of the voter. The physical ballot should be delivered to any officer. The ballot shall be opened and tallied at the election. At the discretion of the Board of Directors, an electronic absentee voting system may be used.

Article VIII - Removal of Officers, Directors, or a Member

- Section 1. Removal of an Officer, Director, or a member shall be proposed in writing and presented in person, by a member, at a Board of Directors meeting. The board (Board) shall then determine if the proposal should be referred to an ad hoc Review Committee for investigation and resolution.
- Section 2. The Review Committee shall make a good faith effort to resolve the problem(s) that led to the removal proposal. Committee meetings and detailed deliberations shall be open only to person(s) specifically invited by the committee. The committee shall report its findings and recommendation(s) to the board (Board) no later than the regular board (Board) meeting in the month following the board (Board) meeting at which the proposal was first made.
- Section 3. Upon a recommendation of the Review Committee, a formal motion may then be entered into the Board minutes by the member who made the original proposal. That motion shall be automatically tabled by the Board until the next regular monthly Board meeting. The motion must then be voted upon by the Board. If further action is required, a publication (notice) shall be sent to all members via First Class U.S. mail, a minimum of two weeks ahead of the next regular monthly membership meeting.

The motion must then be voted upon by the Board. If further action is required, a publication (change to: notice) shall be sent to all members via First Class U.S. mail, a minimum of two weeks (14 days) ahead of the next regular monthly membership meeting (add) or by electronic notice ten days (10 days) before the next membership meeting. At this next meeting, the membership shall resolve to a committee-of-the-whole and conduct a hearing to determine the validity of the reasons for removal. The hearing shall be chaired by the Review Committee Chairman or another FRRL member appointed by him. When the hearing has been completed, an immediate vote shall be taken on the motion. A three-fourths (3/4) vote of the members present shall be required to approve said motion.

Article IX - Committees

Section 1.0 All committee chairs, the database manager, the newsletter editor, and the license trustee, shall be FRRL members, shall possess a valid amateur radio license, and shall be appointed or removed by the President, subject to confirmation by the Board of Directors. (Remove) Unless stated otherwise, these individuals shall appoint the rest of their committee members, and shall have ultimate responsibility for all committee operations within the budgeted expense limits for that committee. The rest of the committee members are not required to have a valid amateur radio license.

(Insert:) Unless stated otherwise, these individuals shall appoint the remaining members of their committee, and shall have ultimate responsibility for all committee operations within the budgeted expense limits for that committee. The regular members of the committee members are not required to have a valid amateur radio license.

Section 2.0 Standing committees are described in Sections 3 2.1 through 10 2.5 of this Article. All standing committee chairs shall be published on the Club website. (Insert): They are: (a) Banquet; (b) Field Day; (c) Public Relations; (d) Nominations and Elections; (e) Technical; (f) Program; and (g) Education. The President, by January 31st of each year, shall appoint from the membership, chairpersons for standing committees.

Add new Sections as shown below:

- Section 2.1 The chairperson for each committee will be responsible for directing the activities of that committee, including (a) communicating with their committee members the necessary actions to be taken; (b) creating a budget or projection of costs to perform the committee's functions and presenting such requests for allocation of funds to the Board of Directors for its consideration; (c) overseeing the expenditure of any funds allocated for the operation of the committee, in cooperation with the Treasurer; (d) encouraging other members to join the committee to assist in performing the committee's duties (including representatives of Corporate Members), and naming such persons as members; (e) appointing a committee vice chair; and (f) preparing such reports as are necessary and required for consideration by the President, the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee, as applicable.
- Section 2.2 Committee chairpersons shall be deemed to have discretion in the performance of the committee's duties and are entitled to make reasonable and necessary decisions that facilitate the operation of their committee, which decisions do not conflict with the Club's Constitution, By-laws or any previous decision made by the Board of Directors.
- Section 2.3 Notwithstanding the foregoing, all decisions made by the committee chairpersons, remain subject to the authority of the Board of Directors.
 - 1. The <u>Field Day Committee</u> shall be responsible for the organization and operation of the ARRL Field Day event.
 - 2. The Education Committee shall be responsible for license training classes. This includes

promotion, scheduling, coordinating instructors and other duties as assigned.

- 3. The <u>Program Committee</u> shall be responsible for providing educational, informative and entertaining programs for the membership at each regular meeting.
- 4. The <u>Public Relations Committee</u> shall inform the general public of meetings, events and activities of the FRRL and, in general, act to promote amateur radio to the general public.
- 5. The <u>Technical Committee</u> shall be available to members who request technical assistance in amateur radio; make recommendations to the Board on technical matters affecting the amateur community as a whole; and provide guidance in the planning of the technical aspects of FRRL projects and activities. (Add): A form to request guidance is available to any club member upon request to any committee member.
- 6. The <u>Banquet Committee</u> shall recruit members and non-members to organize an annual banquet. The banquet program shall recognize amateur radio member accomplishments, for example, license upgrades, DXCC, and WAS. Location, meal planning, program, and pricing will be determined by the Banquet Committee.
- 7. The ad hoc The Nominations and Elections Committee shall consist of three (3) members appointed by the President, subject to confirmation by the Board of Directors, shall be announced at the regular September membership meeting.
- 8. Additional ad hoc (special purpose) committees may be appointed, from time to time, as deemed necessary. Due to the transient nature of these committees, they are not published in the annual FRRL Membership Roster.
- 9. The ad hoc Review Committee shall consist of a chair and two additional members (remove) all appointed by the President, subject to confirmation by the Board of Directors. The committee shall be responsible for investigating and resolving without further membership involvement, if possible any dispute or proposal referred to it by the FRRL Board of Directors. In the event of a dispute against the President, the Vice President shall convene the committee.
- Section 2.4 Additional individual assignments may be appointed by the President, from time to time, as deemed necessary. Due to the transient nature of these committees, they are not published in the annual FRRL Membership Roster.
 - 1. The Database Manager shall maintain a membership roster and provide roster updates as necessary.
 - 2. The License Trustee for Club call W9NE (add)and W9CEQ shall be responsible for the proper use and maintenance of the FRRL's Amateur Radio Club License.
 - 3. The Newsletter Editor shall be responsible for the publication and distribution of the monthly FRRL newsletter. The newsletter shall be used to inform the membership of meetings, notices as required by the Bylaws, events, activities, and other items of interest relating to amateur radio.
 - 4. The Webmaster shall be responsible for the installation and maintenance of the FRRL World Wide Web page. The web site shall be used to inform both the members and the public about FRRL activities, and to provide the means for interactive communications between the members and between potential members and the club officers.
- Section 2.5 All committee Chairs, the Database Manager, the Newsletter Editor, and the License Trustees shall be current FRRL members, and shall possess a valid amateur radio license. The other committee members are not required to have a valid amateur radio license.

Article X - Repeater Board

- Section 1. Purpose. The Repeater Board is tasked with the operation and maintenance of the FRRL repeaters. This board (Board) will be operationally independent of the FRRL (add) Board of Directors but will work within the fiscal constraints of the FRRL budget and will provide quarterly reports to the Board and membership concerning any repeater issues and their corrective actions.
- Section 2. The Repeater Board shall consist of five (5) FRRL members who hold valid amateur radio licenses: Chairman, License Trustee, Secretary and two (2) additional members who are appointed by the FRRL President with the advice and consent of the FRRL Board of Directors. Repeater Board members may only be removed by the FRRL President with the advice and consent of the FRRL Board of Directors.
- Section 3. The License Trustee (add) for the club call of W9CEQ shall serve on the Repeater Board for an indefinite period. The other four (4) members shall serve staggered two-year terms. All fractional term vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the FRRL President with the advice and consent of the FRRL Board of Directors.
- Section 4. The Repeater Board shall meet a minimum of four (4) times a year on a quarterly basis. A quorum of four (4) members is required to conduct all business. The (add: Repeater) Board's Secretary shall take formal minutes of all meetings and present a (insert) written report of each meeting at the next regular FRRL Board of Directors meeting.
- Section 5. The Repeater Board Chair shall be selected by the members of the Repeater Board to serve for a period of one (1) year. To be eligible to serve as the Repeater Board Chair, the candidate must have served on the Repeater Board for a minimum of two (2) years.
- Section 6. The Repeater Board's duties shall consist of:
 - 1. Establishing and enforcing repeater use policies and/or guidelines for all FRRL repeaters. These shall be approved by the FRRL Board of Directors.
 - 2. Establishing and maintaining all repeater site use agreements.
 - 3. These agreements shall be approved by the FRRL Board of Directors and signed by the FRRL President on behalf of the corporation.
 - 4. Providing for the maintenance of all repeater system equipment.
 - 5. Planning and implementing new repeater features and/or replacement of equipment.
 - 6. Developing and following an annual budget that includes both operation and capital expense projections, and income estimates to cover these expenses. This budget shall be approved by the FRRL Board of Directors as a specified section of the annual FRRL Budget.
 - 7. Resolving without further membership and FRRL Board involvement, if possible all disputes about repeater development, maintenance, use, and protocol. If the Repeater Board is unable to do this, the dispute shall be referred to the FRRL Board of Directors for further action.

Article XI - Meetings

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Section 1. The regular monthly membership meetings of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. shall be held on the second Tuesday of every month. The Board of Directors of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. shall hold a monthly meeting at a location, date, and time of its choosing. The FRRL newsletter and the Club Website website shall be the normal vehicle for official notification of all Board and membership meetings.

- Section 2. Any permanent changes in the date, time, and/or location of the regular monthly membership meetings shall be proposed by the Board of Directors and ratified by a simple majority of the membership present at a duly called membership meeting.
- Section 3. All Board, committee, and membership meetings shall be conducted under Robert's Rules of Order unless otherwise specified in the FRRL Bylaws.
- Section 4. Voting at all membership meetings shall be done only by FRRL members. In the case of FRRL family memberships, only those persons domiciled at home and holding a valid amateur radio license shall vote. If a given issue cannot be determined by ayes and nays, a show of hands shall be used unless a simple majority of the members' present vote to use a secret ballot. Proxy voting is not allowed. Absentee voting shall be allowed only for the election of officers and directors as described in Article VII.
- Section 5. All general membership voting, electing, or approving of transactions of club business required by these Bylaws shall be held at a duly called FRRL membership meeting at which a quorum is present. At said membership meetings, a quorum shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the total voting membership except when a twenty percent (20%) quorum shall be required for voting on Bylaws amendments, Officer and Director removal or Member removal.

Article XII - Dues

- Section 1. The membership dues of the Fox River Radio League, Inc. shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00) per year; except that senior citizens (65 & older), military personnel on active duty, and full-time students not yet having attained their twenty-second birthday, shall pay twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per year. A family membership shall be forty dollars (\$40.00) per year regardless of the number of household family members.
- Section 2. The optional FRRL repeater contribution shall be established by the Fox River Radio League Repeater Board per year for all types levels of FRRL members membership.
- Section 3. New members joining the FRRL and/or supporting the FRRL repeaters after the first three (3) months of the year shall pay dues and/or the repeaters contribution pro-rated to the quarter of the year in which they first join. Example: individual or family memberships joining in the April-May-June quarter pays 3/4 seventy-five percent (75%) of the annual rate.
- Section 4. All FRRL membership dues and/or repeater donations for the following year shall be payable starting at the October membership meeting of the preceding current year and shall be due by the January membership meeting of the current following year.
- Section 5. Any FRRL member failing to pay the annual FRRL dues by the close of the January membership meetingof the current year shall no longer be a member of the Fox River Radio League. Membership in the FRRL Groups.io email reflector will be terminated.

Article XIII - Dissolution & Asset Disposition

- Section 1. In the event of the cessation of any FRRL organizational activities for a period of at least eight (8) calendar months, the then remaining Officers and Directors may submit a proposal to dissolve the FRRL to the members.
- Section 2. Upon approval of a majority of the remaining members, the surviving Officers and Directors shall: (1) Pay all outstanding bills, to the extent that FRRL assets permit, (2) Surrender the Corporate Charter to the Secretary of State of Illinois, and (3) Transfer all remaining organization assets to the American Radio Relay League Foundation, a charitable foundation as defined by applicable Federal IRS Regulation(s) and/or Statutes.

Article XIV - Amendments

- Section 1. Any amendment to the FRRL Bylaws shall be proposed in writing by a member. The proposed amendment shall clearly state which Article(s) and Section(s) would be changed.
- Section 2. The proposed amendment shall be read in full at a regular membership meeting by the President; discussed and amended as deemed necessary by the membership; and then tabled for a vote at the next monthly membership meeting following its publication. The proposed amendment shall then be published in the FRRL newsletter. Once the proposed amendment has been published, it is no longer amendable, unless it is published again in its amended form.
- Section 3. At the next regular membership meeting following publication, or re-publication of the proposed amendment, a membership vote shall be conducted. A two-thirds (2/3) majority of the voting members in attendance shall be necessary to pass the proposed amendment. The amendment, unless otherwise specified, shall take effect immediately upon membership ratification.
