FRRL Centennial -- Special Radio Operation Event -- Status Report

As previously announced in the ArcOver and at FRRL membership meetings, a special on -theair operating event took place from June 1 through 15, 2024. Since I did not see a lot of operator sign-ups for time slots in the online schedule prior to the event, I had some concerns about the anticipated level of participation by members operating as W9CEQ. Fortunately, several members did eventually participate to facilitate putting W9CEQ on the air.

CERTIFICATES AND QSL CARDS:

All FRRL members who made a QSO with W9CEQ, using their own call sign, during this event will receive both a commemorative certificate and QSL card to confirm that communication. Previously, it was stated that a formal request should be submitted, along with data about the QSO, in order to obtain these items. That is no longer a requirement. All FRRL members who made one or more QSOs with W9CEQ via their own call, and if their call is found in the master W9CEQ log from this event, will automatically be given both a certificate and QSL card.

Currently, 24 FRRL members were found in the W9CEQ master log. An email was sent to all FRRL members, and it contained a list of those found in the W9CEQ master log for this event. If you contacted W9CEQ using your own call during June 1-15, and you do not see your call sign in the list, please contact K9MMS Gary to have the issue checked and resolved. All FRRL members who operated as W9CEQ during the special event will receive a commemorative certificate acknowledging their participation and level of effort. A request to receive these is not necessary. In addition, all FRRL members who operated as W9CEQ during this event, and if they made 100 or more QSOs, will receive an additional, special award at the FRRL centennial banquet in September.



The distribution of FRRL centennial certificates and QSL cards to members is planned to begin at the August regular membership meeting. This is both for W9CEQ operators as well as all those having made a QSO with W9CEQ. Any of these items not received or picked up at this meeting will be made available for pick up at the banquet in September. After that time, if any such items remain unclaimed, arrangements for can be made for mailing.

PREPARATION OF MASTER LOG:

The logs from the W9CEQ operators were received in various formats – Cabrillo, ADI, copy of paper log, and email notes. All logs were reformatted as needed. Larger ADI logs were first converted in to Cabrillo format. A Microsoft EXCEL file was made which served as a master log template. Each of the 17 logs was then converted into an EXCEL log, which corresponded to the master log format. The small paper logs and email-note logs were each manually entered into a standardized EXCEL file. Then, each of the 17 logs was imported into one master EXCEL log file for all W9CEQ operations. The log file fields are: QSO ALL (number for all 1351), DATE, UTC, BAND, FREQ, MODE, WORKED (call of station worked), SENT, RCVD (signal reports), QTH, OP STN (call of operator), and REM (remark/s).

To assist with reviewing the master log for analyses and statistics, it was sorted in multiple ways. By:

Original Log (in sequence of all 17 imported logs,

CALL-DATE-UTC; QTH-CALL-DATE [CALL = WORKED (call of station worked)]



Amateur Radio Participates in World's Largest Naval Exercise

07/21/2024

"Partners: Integrated and Prepared" is the theme for Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) 2024, the world's largest international military maritime exercise, which began June 27, and will come to a close on August 1. Conducted from Joint Base Pearl Harbor – Hickam, Oahu, Hawaii, the exercise encompasses many islands in the Hawaiian chain.

The event included 29 nations, 40 surface ships, three submarines, 14 national land forces, over 150 aircraft, and more than 25,000 personnel, including amateur radio operators working with health care facilities.

The amateur radio portion of the exercise has been completed. ARRL Assistant Section Manager and State Government Liaison Michael Miller, KH6ML, said 36 amateur radio operators from Hawaii volunteered to demonstrate the value of amateur radio in emergency preparedness and response.

"It turned out very good," said Miller. "Some of hospitals, staff and administrators involved had their first experience with amateur radio. The operators were able to blend their skills using public service radios, satellite phones, as well as amateur radio."

Miller pointed out that hospitals on the smaller islands don't usually have a fulltime communications officer so working with amateur radio gives them experience for future emergencies. The amateurs worked with Health Comm Hawaii which provides amateur radio communications to health care associations in Hawaii during emergencies and disasters.

"Health Comm Hawaii really needs 100 more operators for backup and to build skill sets through monthly exercises," Miller added.

Vice Adm. John Wade, commander, U.S. 3rd Fleet and RIMPAC 2024 Combined Task Force (CTF) commander, said the Rim of the Pacific exercise has grown over the years to be the world's largest and premier joint combined maritime training opportunity. "The exercise's purpose is to build relationships, to enhance interoperability and proficiency and, ultimately, contribute to the peace and stability in the vitally-important Indo-Pacific region."

Many of the volunteers participating in RIMPAC 2024 are also members of other vital emergency communication groups, such as Amateur Radio Emergency Service®(ARES®), Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES), and Community Emergency Response Team (CERT).

FRRL Groups.io Group Message Board

The FRRL has an active mailing list group on Groups.io. Members in good standing are eligible to join the mailing group. You should receive an invite upon joining the group to the email listed in your application. Your active club membership is required to be a member of our Groups.io group.

The group provides the following features:

Messages/Mailing List

View the calendar

Access to files including the club Bylaws and Membership Roster Access to photos submitted by members. Great for sharing projects you're working on!

How do I join?

When your FRRL club membership is confirmed you will receive an email invite from Groups.io. The club membership form requests an email to be used by the club or members to contact you for club or ham radio related subject. If you already have a Groups.io account under a different email and wish to combine them there is a second field for that email. If it is filled in, you will get the invite in that email.

When you join, you can choose a profile you'd like to display to the group, select the email address at which you'd like to receive group messages, choose how you receive group messages, and more. You can receive messages via email or by reading the message boards within the group.

When you first login to your groups.io account, at https://groups.io, you will be presented with a list of the groups that you belong to.







PATRIOTIC... His station and skills are always ready for service to country and community

The Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES) consists of licensed amateurs who have voluntarily registered their qualifications and equipment, with their local ARES leadership, for communications duty in the public service when disaster strikes. Every licensed amateur, regardless of membership in ARRL or any other local or national organization is eligible to apply for membership in ARES. Training may be required or desired to participate fully in ARES. Please inquire at the local level for specific information. Because ARES is an amateur radio program, only licensed radio amateurs are eligible for membership. The possession of emergency-powered equipment is desirable, but is not a requirement for membership.

ARES

Every licensed amateur, regardless of membership in ARRL or any other local or national organization is eligible to apply for membership in ARES.






70 cm Band 5 MHz Negative Offset Example
