The January program will contain a contest of guessing the resonant frequency of an antenna with some builtin surprises. First prize \$10, second prize \$5. I will have an MFJ antenna analyzer that will be projected up on the wall for you to see and learn about. I will also have a Palomar noise bridge and an old Heathkit grid dip oscillator. Given the available time, I will show as many possible different measurements and techniques that I can and explain why they are important of useful.
