#### **Kermit Carlson**

The ARRL announced today that Kermit Carlson, W9XA as been announced as the new Chairman of the VHF/UHF Advisory Committee (VUAC). Kermit has been a long time member of the Fox River Radio League and has fulfilled many of the leadership positions. ARRL Central Division Director, Dick Isely, W9GIG, reported the announcement during a break in the ARRL Board of Directors meeting held in Newington, CT. Dick, also a member of the FRRL had appointed Kermit to serve as the Central Division VUAC committee member in 2005. The committee was formed in 2005 to "create contest environments, which will invite additional participation in ARRL VHF.UHF contests." The VUAC sponsors a special award certificate for those who complete QSO's above 50 MHz. Another prestigious award sponsored by the VUAC is the Fred Fish Memorial Award recognizing amateurs who have worked all 488 grid squares on 6 meters. #### New FRRL Member "Goes all the Way!"

There have been very few times when I have heard of an individual sitting down at a VE session and taking all the test elements during one test session, and becoming an Extra! New FRRL member Walt Jaskierny accomplished this rare feat during the January 20th session.

I asked our club's VE Chairman, Doug W9RD whether he had ever had a person test all the way through before, and he too believes it is a very rare occurrence. Doug cannot comment on any of those who tested, but did let me know that for a ham to take the Tech, General and Extra Class tests in one sitting is quite extraordinary.

Walt will now have to wait for his ticket. I'm sure he is quite pleased with his efforts. In order to learn a bit more about Walt, I asked him about his job and introduction to ham radio. Here is his response:

"My background: I am a power systems engineer at Fermilab specializing in high current DC systems. I worked as a technician for the first 25 years at Fermilab and have been an engineer for the last 15 years. I became interested in amateur radio in high school, I knew someone with a General license. At that time he and I understood that a General could administer the code and written test. I took and passed the Novice code test in 1963 or 64 and when he filed the paperwork with the FCC and requested the written test he was informed that there had been a recent change in FCC rules that Generals would no longer be allowed to administer the tests. I would have to go to the FCC office and start over. With that information I lost interest at that time to get a license.

On my study techniques: I studied a total ten days one or two hours a day. I had obtained copies of the "ARRL Ham Radio License Manual level 1" and Gordon West's "Technician Class" and read each book once cover to cover. I then got a copy of "ARRL General Q & A" and read that twice. I did the online practice test for Technician and General about 6 or 8 times each, usually getting none to two wrong. I had no study materials available for the Extra class license test so I did the online test 4 or 5 times and found I passed about half of the times I took it. (I have not worked with or studied RF since I was in college and was quite amazed how much I could still remember after 40 years.) Then I took the test last Tuesday. Right now I still have not decided what area of amateur radio I am most interest in. I do plan on starting to study code again starting this week."

Congratulations Walt! And, welcome to the FRRL.
