Kendall County ARES[®] Rolling on the River Event Summary

On August 23rd, 24th, and 25th the Kendall Co. Amateur Radio Emergency Service[®] (ARES[®]) supported the Illinois Environmental Council with safety and support communications for their weekend long fund raising event. This year due to flooding the canoe and kayak events for Saturday and Sunday were canceled but the bicycle ride on Saturday was in full swing with an estimated 485 bikers on 14, 25, 44, 64, and 100 mile routes. The start was delayed a half hour due to flooding along the route which in turn made the day run a little longer than expected. Amateur Radio operators didn't just assist SAG, we were SAG for this event. Along with SAG and Net Control we provided communications for the six rest stop areas and provided shadow communications for the two directors (Event director and Operations director). In all, 22 HAM radio operators were involved.

Assistance to the Kendall Co. ARES[®] was provided by LaSalle Co. ARES[®], Grundy Co. ARES[®], Kane Co. ARES[®], Cook Co. ARES[®], Naperville PD Amateur Radio Operators, and the Fox River Radio League, FRRL.

For Net control operations we had the luxury of using a modified construction trailer made personally by Mark, K9ZQ to be a HAM Radio mobile command center. We tested the Grundy Co. portable repeater in its first deployment – we learn that there are still some tweaks to be made but we did prove that it could be set up quickly to become an operational repeater. Bob, AB9EE was involved in a nursing home evacuation in Morris so was unable to deliver the portable repeater until the morning of the event. The Yorkville repeater worked flawlessly for our primary operations. Cell phone connectivity was very spotty throughout the route area including at the net control location causing the operator running the phone bank (2 phones) to be stationed in a separate location from the radio operators.

An emergency cell phone number was provided to riders to call Net Control if they needed assistance during the ride. In all we had 13 SAG transports and about 60 calls to the event emergency phone number. Net control, worked the communications to the cell phone operator, the shadow operators, and on-grounds operations using the deployed Grundy Co. ARES[®] portable repeater and the off ground operations (SAG, Rest Stop support, Sign troubleshooting, Sweep, and Sign pickup) using the Yorkville repeater. The APRS mode was used by net control to track some SAG operators (those with that mode available).

I guess it's all summed up by the comments back to us by the Rolling on the River Event Director:

"Your team was PHENOMENAL!!! You were responsive, wonderful to work with, and grace under pressure...." In her letter of thanks to us, she also said: "What else can we do for you next year (other than to say THANK YOU!!!)? I wouldn't do this without your team....so hope you'll hang in there with us next year!"
