# 47th Annual Mid-American Canoe & Kayak Race

The Mid-American Canoe & Kayak Race returned on September 28, 2008 after a 28-month hiatus. The day was cloudy and cool and the river was rippling nicely, with a helpful tailwind, which made for just about perfect paddling conditions. More than 200 entries went down the 6- mile course from the VFW in Batavia to the Prisco Center in Aurora. Our volunteers who graciously helped me provide communications were Katherine KC9KJU, Bart KC9FQA, Eric AB9OS, Keith N9YA, Tom WB9CHY, Kent W9NDW and Cyd N9CV. Kent acted as net control and Cyd handled the weather desk from her QTH. Katherine, Bart and Eric at the portage marked off boat numbers, which helped the people at the end to know that no one was lost or hurt somewhere on the river. Tom and Keith helped the race and timing officials at the finish line. We used the FRRL 2m repeater, which worked beautifully. Thank you to the repeater board for the use of the repeater for this event.

The race was uneventful, no capsizes, no missing boats due to a pizza run, as in a prior year, and no problems with the repeater. A little comedy was provided by some of the racers. The first heat contained a Viking boat, complete with horned helmets for the paddlers. Later, four friends in two boats wore Hawaiian leis and grass skirts. One of the boats even sported its own grass skirt. And, finally, a boat with four passengers had a total of twelve legs. Stumped? Along with their humans, two dogs were on board, looking very happy with the prospect of a ride with no window glass to keep the wind from their faces.

#### A Most Unusual QSL Card

What's the most unusual QSL card you've ever received? QSL cards come in many forms. Some are black and white, some use a single color and many resemble a full color photograph. Some are professionally printed; many are printed at home using a color inkjet printer with a custom design by the operator.

In my short time as an amateur radio operator I have received quite a few QSL cards, especially since upgrading to the General class license. Some have been very plain, some in color and a few that were quite fancy. However, the most unusual QSL card I've ever received came in a small cardboard box. Upon arriving home from work one afternoon, my 8 year old, Collin, came running to the door saying "Dad, you got a package, you got a package!" Once I was settled in, I examined the box. The return address was from L. Lynn Lamb, W4NL in Maryville, Tennessee. I wasn't expecting anything; I hadn't ordered anything especially from another ham. So what was in that unexpected box?

My wife Tamie, KC9LWX, suggested opening it outside! I told her I didn't think that was necessary. So I carefully opened the unexpected package. Right on top was a QSL card from Lynn Lamb, W4NL bearing his signature, my call sign, and a thanks scribbled in the corner. Beneath that was red colored bubble wrap. Whatever it was, it was light and unusually shaped. Beneath all this was a baseball cap, a red baseball cap! Embroidered on the front of the cap are my call sign and my first name. There was no note; there was no contact information, nothing. How mysterious.

Looking back in my logs, I do not have a record of contacting W4NL. Other recent radio activity was working 40 meter phone at the Huntley Fall Fest a few weeks ago. Perhaps, he was one of the many rag chew contacts I made that day. I asked around to other hams wondering if they had ever received a hat a part of a QSL. No one including a ham who has been licensed since childhood could ever recall getting a hat as part of a QSL.

I will send one of my QSL cards to W4NL with a thank you for the hat once I confirm the contact with the Huntley Fall Fest logs. Otherwise, this has to be the most unusual QSL exchange I've ever experienced.
